

PREAMBLE: SOURCE was interned in Russian convict camp # 223/III North of VORKUTA (6730N/6400E) from June 1950 to December 1953. During the time from 1951 to summer 1952 he occasionally met a man who was interned in the same camp and who claimed to be an officer of the US Army.

INFORMATION:

The name of this person was unknown by SOURCE. He stated that the man was approximately thirty-five (35) years of age, 1.8 m tall, slender, with blonde hair and blue eyes. He had a twisted mouth. This man claimed to be a colonel of the US Army and told SOURCE that he had been the military attache at LENIN-GRAD (5955N/3015E). SOURCE stated that the man spoke English fluently as well as German, French and Russian. It was striking how well the man was oriented about the present political situation. The man was engaged as a bookkeeper within convict camp 223/III. In the summer of 1952 he left the VORKUTA area.
