part of John Nyce's property was conveyed to him, and by him to William Dunshee, and by him, the same year, to James Swartwood, who, in 1794, conveyed it to Samuel Seely." It is further related that Peter Swartwood moved thence to Wyoming, Pa., but, on July 3, 1778, at the time of the massacre, was fortunately in Ulster County, N. Y. It is also said that he did not return to Wyoming, but seated his family on a farm on Cayuta Creek, in Tioga County (now in Chemung County), N. Y., where some of his former Pennsylvania neighbors were cultivating land, and his sons Jacobus, Isaac and Emanuel Swartwood had settled in 1797. His daughter, Mrs. Elizabeth Allington, it is said, died soon after the family settled on Cayuta Creek. One of his daughters married Jesse, son of Abraham Barnes of Lackawaxen, and was recently living in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, aged 86 years. Peter Swartwood died in 1841, and his second wife, in 1842. It is said he was the father of eighteen children, and, at his death, there were one hundred and forty of his descendants living.

CXXXVII. Johannes, son of Jacobus and Lydia Decker Swartwood, (Swartwout,) was born in Walpack township, Sussex County, province of New Jersey, on March 4, and baptized there on March 31, 1754, married Sarah, daughter of Daniel and Blandinah Vredenburgh Decker, born on November 8, 1757, and died September 28, 1831. He died in the town of Spencer, Tioga County, N. Y., on December 12, 1837.

Memoranda. On September 2, 1782, Johannes Swartwood was commissioned by Governor William Livingston of New Jersey, a lieutenant in Captain Manuel Hover's company, in the Third Sussex County Militia Regiment, commanded by Colonel John Rosekrans. Johannes Swartwood, it would seem, settled in the town of Owego, Tioga County, N. Y., about 1796. His son Jacob served as a private in the war of 1812-15, and was taken prisoner and never afterwards was any information received from him. His daughter Parmelia married a Mr. White from Connecticut.
