

DOCUMENT No. 11.

The last will and testament of William Kittlehuyn of the town of Schaghticoke, Rensselaer County, New York, September 17, 1817, and codicil, August 29, 1818.

The Last Will and Testament of William Kittlehuyn of the Town of Schaghticoke, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound mind and memory, blessed be Almighty God for the same, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say, First I give unto the heirs of my oldest son Douw Kittle, deceased, the sum of Two hundred and sixty-two Dollars which is to come out of a Mortgage given by William and John Myers, which money was let to Simon Kittle, at the time the first division of moneys of my Estate and the said sum to be equally divided among the said heirs of Douw at the time the said money shall be paid by the said William and John Myers as is stated by the said Bond and Mortgage given by said Myers—And I do further order that my Doctor Bill and funeral charges shall first be paid out of the monies which I shall have left after my decease. And all the remaining money and property after that shall be equally divided among my six children, namely : my daughters Nelly, Hester, Elizabeth, my sons, Douw, Simon, and David, meaning that the heirs of Douw shall have the part he should have been entitled to if alive, which will be one sixth part of all the property I shall possess at the time of my decease or shall be entitled to either in Law or equity—And I also order and direct that my Executors, who are hereafter appointed by me, as soon as may be after my decease to make a settlement among the heirs, and as the moneys become due and collected the same shall be divided among the heirs as their proportion shall be, and the part of money which shall fall due to the heirs of Douw shall be paid them in the same manner as the rest whenever collected and when of age. And I further order and appoint my two sons, viz. : Simon Kittle and David Kittlehuyn, my Executors of this my last Will and Testament that they shall see the whole executed and divided the remains of my Estate among the heirs according to my wishes and devises. And whomsoever of my heirs shall make any Quarrel or disturbance in this my will or any part thereof shall not be entitled to any part of my Estate either Real or personal, and his or hers shall be divided among the rest of the remaining heirs. Hereby revoking all former Wills by me made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 17th day of Sept., 1817.
