

faithfully, never missing duty for a day for nearly two years and then only for a short time. He was in the first battle at Pea Ridge, where the ground was literally covered with the dead. He was in a battle at Perryville, and also a severe one at Murfreesboro where a number of bullets passed through his clothes and hat, and he was only slightly wounded. He endured long marches and at times on short allowance. He marched with Sherman to Atlanta; was in a number of skirmishes at Calhoun and at last received a wound in his hip which caused his death. He was buried in the National Cem. During his term of service he sent home \$400.

After Mr. Alvord's death, his widow and daughter Sarah, went to Philadelphia to live with his son James B. Alvord.
