Phineas Alvord, when a boy, worked for Henry Buell, a farmer residing in East Bloomfield, N. Y. After being in the employ of Mr. Buell for seven years, in 1823, he bought a pair of steers and a wagon which he loaded with apples and started for Mt. Morris, locating on the land for which his father had contracted and assuming the entire indebtedness. He soon built a log house, in the construction of which no sawed timber was used. By dint of good management and industry he soon paid for his place, where he continued to live as a successful farmer.
