PLACES IN U. S. BEARING THE NAME ALVORD.

ALVORD, San Bernardino Co., Cal., took its name from Hon. William Alvord of San Francisco; also Alvord in Inyo Co., Cal., from same source.

ALVORD, Ia., took its name from George Raymond Alvord.

ALVORD, Mo., named by Geo. F. Walker, supt. of R. R. in honor of his sister Mrs. Lucy (Walker) Alvord, wife of Nathaniel C. Alvord, of Trenton, Mich.

ALVORD, Tex., named by Everett Morton Alvord, an official of the railroad.

ALVORD, N. Y., an old resident says that it was so called because the name seemed a pleasing one. It is probable however that the Alvord
