

DATA RECEIVED TOO LATE FOR INSERTION IN THE  
BODY OF THE WORK.

C. A. Hoppin, Jr., sends the following from the register at Ashill, Co. of Somerset, England: Richard, son of Thomas Alford, baptized Feb. 9, 1616; Elizabeth, wife of Thomas Alford, was buried June 11, 1617; Thomas Alford and Joan Hawkins married May 11, 1618; Joan, wife of Thomas Alford, was buried Aug. 1, 1622; Richard, son of Thomas Alford, was buried Jan. 6, 1624.

The above tends to weaken the theory advanced on page 15 which makes Joan Hawkins the mother of the settler. It would now seem quite probable that there were two of the name Thomas Alford, one of Whitestaunton and the other of Ashill, but on the other hand it is to be noted that Ashill and Whitestaunton are only five miles apart, also that during the four years (1619-22) following his marriage to Joan Hawkins, no children of Thomas Alford were recorded as baptized at Ashill, which is quite singular. May it not reasonably be believed that he returned to Whitestaunton, and had children baptized there, where the register is missing? Joan's baptism (Dec. 8, 1622) may have been deferred four months by reason of her mother's death. The records already given show quite conclusively that Thomas Alford was the father of the immigrants. Whether Joan Hawkins was the mother may well be questioned.

The will of Elisha Alvord (No. 507) dated Apr. 29, 1852, gives the following regarding the children of William Alvord (No. 506): Emily, wife of D. Paddoc, John Alvord, res. at Galine, Mich.; Helen, wife of — Kennons, res. Madison Co., Wis. Charles Alvord and George Alvord residing at Michigan City, Ind.; all of age.

Mary A. Ward married Mar. 2, 1842, Butler Alvord (No. 676). She was born Holland Patent, N. Y., Sept. 4, 1812, daughter of Asel Ward and Patty Hamlin, formerly of Middletown, Conn. Mrs. Butler Alvord died Feb. 26, 1889.
