Cent.; Milw. & Superior R.Rs. Tel. Exp. Banks. A port of entry, and the largest city in the State. The manufacturing interests here are numerous and extensive. The Bay View Rolling Mills employ nearly 2000 men, the E. P. Allis machine shops about 1500. Knit goods are very extensively produced. Flour is also manufactured in very great quantities. The mammoth breweries produce annually over 1,000,000 barrels of beer. Other important products are leather, lumber, boots and shoes, carriages, furniture, tobacco and cigars. Milwaukee has an excellent harbor and a very large shipping trade, being among the greatest grain markets in the world. Its wheat shipments are over 9,000,000 bushels annually, and large quantities of corn, barley, oats, rye, flour, and lumber are handled. Here are a State Normal School, an Industrial School for Girls, and, in the vicinity, a National Soldiers' Home.
