

Manville Delos Alvord, after leaving home, went to Whitewater, Wis., and Decorah, Ia.; thence to Chicago to a commercial school and from there to Eagle, Wis., and Mazomanie, Wis. He left Mazomanie with eight others, Mar. 18, 1859, for Pike's Peak, but returned to Mazomanie in Dec., 1864. In 1875 he moved with his family to Milwaukee, and the year following to Chicago where he remained until 1878, when he went to Ithaca, N. Y., for one year, after which he returned to Mazomanie, Wis. He was much interested in the family genealogy and gathered data of his grandfather's descendants.
