8 **William Twining**, son of **4** William; b. Eastham, Sept. 2, 1704; d. *Orleans, Nov. 17, 1769; m. Apphia Lewis, Feb. 21, 1728. Will made Mch. 19, 1769; proved Dec. 12, same year. In it he mentions his wife Apphia; sons, *Thomas* and *Elijah*, and grand daughter Apphia Rogers. Wid. was member of Orleans Church (Cong.) before 1773. It is said by one of his des. that he was a lawyer in O., but of this we have no proof.

* Orleans was set off from Eastham in 1797. Since that date South Eastham has been known as Orleans, some portions of which is the oldest part of Old Eastham.
