

98 Lewis Twining, son of **47** Thomas, b. M'ch 24, 1830, d. Oct. 24, 1871, Topeka, Kansas. Was engaged in farming, North Collins, Erie Co., N. Y., till about 1860. Became a prominent Apiarist, traveling much in the Wabash Valley and the West. An intelligent but eccentric man; m. *first*, Mary E. Sherman, Oct. 23, 1853, b. Sept. 12, 1834, Fall River, Mass; a well-informed woman of many excellent qualities; grad. C. L. S. C.; Friends Society; res. Lawton Station, Erie Co., N. Y.

99 Charles Twining, son of **48** Thomas, b. Aug. 23, 1822, Groton, N. Y. Educated at Groton Academy. In 1847 went to Lancaster Co., Pa., to teach and remained there till the fall of 1856, in which year he organized the Warren, Pa., Borough Union School, which he conducted as Prin. to 1863; thence to Waterford, Erie Co., Pa.; engaged in other business till 1870; 1870 to 1878, Supt. of Union City, Pa., schools; 1878 to 1884, Supt. Erie Co., Pa., Common schools. Moved to Sumner Co., Kansas, 1885; m. *first*, Mary Stanton, July 30, 1850, Lancaster, Pa., b. Feb. 29, 1829; d. Aug. 27, 1873, of consumption; m.
