In 1809 he was elected by the University Senate to preach the Buchanan Sermon. He has been a great benefactor to both his parishes, not only by his kindness and liberality to the poor, but also by restoring and beautifying the churches of both. some painted windows to Sileby Church, and other decorations. He rebuilt the old bridge in the village; and by his active exertions and some cost to himself, he enforced the rebuilding of another bridge in the parish of Sileby, which, from its dangerous state for a long period of time, had been the cause of many accidents. In 1854 a handsome silver epergne was presented to him by his parishioners of Sileby (solely) as a tribute of their esteem and respect. He was a
