## NOTES.

This Pedigree is founded on a sketch drawn up many years ago by the Rev. John Phillips of Mambury, North Devon. His papers passed to his great nephew, the Rev. Edward Arthur Dayman, who allowed me to copy the Stevens and other Pedigrees. Mr. Phillips, however, gave no references to authorities and very few dates. I am greatly indebted to the Rev. J. Ingle Dredge for extracts from Parish Registers, and to "Merland's" notes published in the *North Devon Journal*.

- (1) Mr. Phillips mentions a brother called Hugh, who died in 1640, having survived a son William, who was buried at Buckland Brewer in 1635; a sister called Catherine, who had issue; a daughter called Mary, who married Henry Rolle, Esq., of Torrington Register Mary Stevens, who married Henry Rolle, Esq., of Buckland Brewer, daughter of William and Margaret Stevens. M.I. at Atherington, Devon. "Grace, wife of William Stevens of Great Torrington, gent., died the 10th day of Novemb. in the year of our Lord God MCLII ye year of the age LXX." - (5) Edward Fleming, gent., and Mrs. Grace Stevens married at West Down, 22 June 1683.
- (6) This Henry Stevens built the present house at Crosswicks, which was the original seat at Vialstone having been burnt down. Vialstone formerly belonged to the Risdon's (Risdon's "Survey of Devon," p. 24). Wincote also became Risdon property after the Barrys (cp. Col. Vivian's "Visitations," p. 44). Cross was formerly possessed by a family called Stevens, Esq.
- (7) Christiana Maria Rolle was a sister of Henry, Lord Rolle. Lord Rolle died without issue in 1813, and by his will the property passed to the Rev. Mark Trefusis; 2nd son of Lord Clinton. The heir presumptive under the will is said to be the present Lord Clinton.
