Col. Hunt's wife survived him but a few months; she was from an old respectable Massachusetts family; she was Eunice Wellington, daughter of Samuel and Abigail Saunders Wellington, of Waltham; who was son of Thomas and Rebecca Whittemore Wellington; who was son of Joseph and Elizabeth Straight Wellington; who was son of Roger Wellington, of Watertown, and Mary, daughter of Dr. Richard Palgrave, of Charlestown. HENRY JACKSON HUNT, of Detroit. 1792.

Col. Henry J. Hunt, of Detroit, was oldest son of Col. Thomas Hunt, U. S. A. He married Anna Mackintosh, in 1814. He died in middle life,—no descendants. He occupied a very high social position in the community in which he lived; his early death was deeply lamented by all who knew him.
