

William de Valence occur with those of Sir John de Northwood, a baron, and Sir Andrew de Sageville of Essex, and Le Fitz Barnard, all of Kent, as Knights Tempore Ed. I.

The Arms of Poynings impaling Northwood were in St. Peter's, Canterbury.

Poynings, Sackville, and Fitz Barnard are in the east window of the chancel.

The family of Scales succeeded that of Northwood in this parish, 1386.

Sir Henry de Coggeshall held Sherne Hall, Shalford, and Codham Hall, Wethersfield, till his death in 1375.

Mr. Elliot does not think that the font in this church is much later than the last mentioned date.

#### ARMS ON THE FONT.

- A. Gu. Six escallopes. 1, 2, 3, arg. *Scales.*
- B. Arg. A cross between 4 escallopes. *Coggeshall*
- C. Barry of six, az. and or., on a chief of the first two pallets, between as many Esquires, based dexter and sinister of the second, an inescutcheon *Mortimer.*
- D. A fess between two chevrons. *Fitz Walter.*
- E. Quarterly, gu. and or., in the first quarter. *De Vere.*
- F. A chevron between three roundels, a bordure indented (not known).

#### ARMS ON ROOF OF PORCH.

(INSIDE).

De Vere. Coggeshall. Northwood of Shalford. Mortimer. Braybrook, Bishop of London, which approximately gives the date 1381, 1404.

A modern shield of H. R. G. Marriott, Esq, who restored the porch, has also been inserted.
