30 May 1741. Pretended will of Stephen Bisse, late of Wimbledon, co. Surry, Esq., a widower, dec^d. Cause between Bisse Richards, Esq., the nephew and pretended sole ex'or, the party promoting the said cause, on the one part, and Rebecca Rowe (wife of Laurence Rowe) and Jane Shute, widow, the sisters and next of kin, and also Mary Riland (wife of Rev^d Richard Riland, clerk), the niece by the brother, Edward Walters and Mary Walters, spinster, nephew and niece by a sister, and George Bray, Edward Bray, Mary Vigers (wife of John Vigers), and Margaret Bray, spinster, nephews and nieces by a sister, the parties against whom the said cause is promoted, of the other part. Said will pronounced null and void 10 Dec. 1746. (375 Edmunds.)

2 Feb. 1745. Susanna Bisse, wife of Thomas Bisse of St Bartholomew's the Great, London, "fface Painter." Indenture or deed of settlement, dated 14 Sept. 1743 and made previous to my marriage, between the said Thomas Bisse of the first part, myself by the name of Susannah Norman, spinster, of the second part, and Henry Entwisle, gent., and Thomas Martin, gent., of the third part—goddaughter Susanna Martin—children of sister Eleanor, wife of said Thomas Martin—nieces Eleanor and Mary Hill—sister Mary Hill's eldest daughter—brother and sister Thomas Hill and Mary his wife—brother and sister Thomas Martin and Eleanor his wife—said husband, ex'or. Witnesses, Ellen Bisse and H. Entwisle. Proved 13 April 1748 by said ex'or. (107 Strahan.)

12 Dec. 1746. Adm'on to Stephen Bisse, Esq., late of Wimbledon, co. Surry, widower, dec^d, granted to Eleanor Richards, widow, the sister and next of kin, sentence having been pronounced against his will on 10th inst. De bonis non in June 1766.

25 Nov. 1747. John Bisse of the city of Bristol, merchant. Testator made a former will in Madeira in 1730. Nephew the Rev^d Mr Edward Bisse, clerk—property in Bath and Portbury—aunt Mary Covant—niece Eirenia Mason, sister of said Edward—John Covant of Portbury left property by will to said Edward and Eirenia—said Edward, ex'or. Proved 13 May 1755 by said ex'or. (122 Paul.)

5 Oct. 1749. Adm'on to James Bisse, late of Codicote, co. Herts, Esq., dec^d, granted to George Poyner Bisse, the son.

5 Dec. 1750. Rebecca Biss of Mount Street par. St. George, Hanover Square, co. Midd^x, spinster. Niece Jane Williams—niece Sarah Bartlett and her daughter—niece whose maiden name was Jane Biss—cousin Mary Hales—nephew John Biss—to be buried in the second-best burial-ground belonging to St George's, Hanover Square—nephews John Biss, William Ames, John Ames, Robert Ames, and Thomas Ames—nieces Jane whose maiden name was Biss, Jane Williams, and Sarah Bartlet—nephew John Biss, now or late of Nunney near Froom, co. Somerset, ex'or. Proved 14 Oct. 1751 by said ex'or. (275 Busby.)

10 Dec. 1750. Ellen Bisse of St. Bartholomew's the Great, London, widow. "If I die in London to be buried in the church of St Dunstan in the East, near late husband William Bisse"—said husband bequeathed by will to the children of his brothers Thomas Bisse and John Bisse—nephew Thomas Bisse of London and his brother
