Will reg<sup>d</sup> in Jan. last.

24 May 1777. Mary Riland of Sutton Coldfield, co. Warwick, widow. Son Rev. M<sup>r</sup> Richard Bisse Riland—son Rev. M<sup>r</sup> John Riland—daughters-in-law M<sup>rs</sup> Mary Riland, wife of said son M<sup>r</sup> Richard Bisse R., and M<sup>rs</sup> Ann Riland, wife of said son M<sup>r</sup> John R.—nieces M<sup>rs</sup> Katherine Riland and her sisters M<sup>rs</sup> Elizabeth Cooke, M<sup>rs</sup> Sarah Fletcher, and M<sup>rs</sup> Jane Spencer, and their husbands, M<sup>r</sup> John Cooke, M<sup>r</sup> Thomas Fletcher, and Rev. 24 Aug. 1721. Adm'on to Eleanor Biss, late of St James, Westminster, co. Midd<sup>x</sup>, spinster, dec<sup>d</sup>, granted to Elizabeth Eade alias Biss (wife of William Eade), the mother.

20 July 1752. Elizabeth Biss of Kensington, co. Midd<sup>x</sup>, widow. Son Samuel Biss of Kensington, dyer, died intestate—daughter-in-law Mary Biss, widow of said Samuel, sole ext'x. Proved 3 Jan. 1753 by said ext'x.

9 Aug. 1692. Adm'on to John Bysse, late of par. of SS. Ann and Agnes, London, dec<sup>d</sup>, granted to Mary Bysse, widow, the relict.

#### COURT OF DEAN AND CHAPTER OF ST. PAUL'S.

23 July 1680. Renunciation of adm'on to Bartholomew Bissc, late of St Giles, Cripplegate, but in Christchurch Hospital, London, dec<sup>d</sup>, by Jane, the relict.

#### LONDON, SHOREHAM, AND CROYDON COURT.

1713-4. James Bisse of St Mary's, Newington, co. Surry, schoolmaster. Sister Margaret Light—brother Robert Light's children—mother made a will—Elizabeth, Anne, Jane, and John Robinson—brother Henry Cane, ex'or. Affidavit 14 May 1715 by Laurence Francklin of St Mary's, Newington Butts, co. Surry, gent., aged 57, and Anne Robinson of the same, aged 25. Said Laurence a neighbour to testator, who died on or about Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> inst., for nearly 40 years. The ex'or, Harry Cane, brother by the half-blood, as said Laurence believes, to testator. Said Anne, daughter of Elizabeth Robinson, widow, who now lives in the said par. of St Mary. Said will proved 14 May 1715 by Henry Cane, the brother and ex'or. (Fo. 1289.)
