



PEDIGREE OF KING, CO. KENT.



Louisa Maria King, born 6 Nov. 1807; lived, died, and bur. at Wateringbury; died 4 May 1885. She mentions all her nephews and nieces in her will, and is mentioned with her sister Elizabeth in Joseph Cox's will 1856 as a co-legatee.

Knowles King, born 5 Sep. 1809; bapt. at Wateringbury; educated at Yalding, and Merchant Taylors', London (see Robinson's "School List"); articulated to Ed. Hooker of Sheerness; commenced practice as a Solicitor at Maidstone 1829; retired 1866 in favour of his son-in-law and eldest son ("Hughes and King"), which firm, on the lamented death of the former in 1879, became again "King and Hughes" by reception of deceased's son Henry Alexander Hughes, who, by early demise in 1896, was succeeded by his brother Francis Edward, late in practice at Cardiff. The aforesaid Knowles King, after residence successively at Summerfield House, which he purchased of Major Teale's heirs (see Smith's "History of Maidstone," 1839), and Somerfield Terrace, hard by, at his retirement removed to Sidmouth House, Great Malvern, and finally, after travel in South Africa and elsewhere, took up his abode at 13 Elliot Place, Blackheath, where he died 12 July 1871, and was bur. in Wateringbury Churchyard by the side of four of his predeceased children at the south entrance on the west of the pathway. His will proved 18 Sep. 1871. (Modern Doomsday, Devisors of, £2087.)

Cary Elizabeth Henham, dau. of Thomas Henham of The Parsonage House in East Peckham; born 31 May 1813; bapt. there 1 July following; named Cary after her maternal grandmother's mother (Cary of Mayfield, co. Sussex); always wrote her name Carey; married at East Peckham 5 Sep. 1832; died 7 Jan. 1892 at the residence of her daughter Mrs. Henry Hughes, The Bower, Maidstone. As a child she was at school at Wateringbury for six years with her future sister-in-law Louisa King, and afterwards, in 1829, at "Stanley Grove," Mortlake, co. Surrey, kept by a Miss Conder, at which period she first met and became engaged to her future husband, and at which school she first commenced to keep a diary, which she continued to the last year of her life, and bequeathed for the perusal of her children and grandchildren. She was bur. in Wateringbury Churchyard. Her will proved in the Prerogative Court of Canterbury. (See HENHAM FAMILY.)

Naomi Frances King, born 18 Feb. 1871; bapt. at Chapel Royal, Brighton.
