

Joseph Cox, mentioned in grandfather Joseph Cox's will; died unmarried at Eynsford 29 Sep. 1714.

Henry Cox of Eynsford, bapt. there 28 Oct. 1700; was ultimately possessed, in equal moieties with his uncle Henry Cox, of the Stokehaw property by descent, and by devise of the one-fourth part therein of his brother Thomas Cox, by his will dated 1726, to whom his said uncle Henry Cox by will dated 1732 devised his estate at Rendlys Hoath in fee, and appointed him sole executor; died 27 Aug. 1737, aged 36, and bur. at Eynsford 1 Sep. following. M.I. Will dated 9 Aug. 1737; proved at Court of Deanery of the Arches of London, Shoreham, and Croydon 2 Nov. 1737 by Mary Cox his relict and sole executrix.

Mary, eldest dau. of Solomon Penury of West Yoke in the parish of Ash, near Ridley, co. Kent; bapt. at Farningham, co. Kent, 22 Sep. 1703; settlement on her marriage 16 and 17 Feb. 1727; mentioned in father's will 1733; in her brother Solomon Penury's 1762; in her sister Elizabeth Penury's 1779, wherein she was appointed one of the residuary legatees; on the decease of her niece Mary Penury in 1772 she became entitled, in equal moieties with her sister Elizabeth, to the said principal estate called Middletons at Longfield, and on the death of said sister Elizabeth (unmarried) in 1784, became sole heir of her father; died 19 Oct. 1794; bur. at Eynsford. Will proved in Prerogative Court of Canterbury 12 Nov. 1794 by Thomas Fuller, Clement Taylor, and John Williams.

Joseph Cox of Charlton in the parish of Farningham, co. Kent, bapt. at Eynsford 11 Feb. 1728; executor to will of uncle Solomon Penury, dated 1762; became entitled in fee by descent, and by devise to him by his brother Henry, of all his real estates, in his will dated 1779, of the entirety of the said Stokehaw and Rendlys Hoath estate at Chiddingstone possessed by his ancestor Joseph Cox of Chiddingstone in 1675 and 1699; by the will of his aunt Elizabeth Penury, dated 1779, he (his brother Henry, the co-devisee, being dead) inherited her moiety of certain estates in the county of Kent, including Middletons at Longfield; died intestate 3 Sep. 1793, aet. 64, and bur. at Eynsford 11 Sep. following.

Elizabeth, dau. of John King of Hever-next-Chiddingstone, co. Kent; married at Farningham 13 March 1786; administratrix to her husband 24 Sep. 1793; died 7 Feb. 1798. Will dated 2 Feb. 1798; proved in Prerogative Court of Canterbury. (Not related to King family of this Record.)

Mary Cox, only dau., bapt. at Eynsford 7 May 1731; mentioned in her father's will, dated 1737, and in that of her aunt Elizabeth Penury 1790; married at Farningham 13 May 1765; died 10 June 1779 at Eynsford.

Charles Colyer of Farningham, eldest son of Charles Colyer of same place (brother of Elizabeth, wife of aforesaid Henry Cox); mentioned in will of Elizabeth Penury, dated 1779, and in that of Mary Cox 1790; bur. at Farningham.

Henry Cox, bapt. at Eynsford 8 May 1733; executor to will of uncle Solomon Penury 1762; died without issue 13 July 1780; bur. at Eynsford 17 July. M.I. Will dated 26 June 1779, devising all his real estates to his brother Joseph Cox, who, as executor, proved his will in the Prerogative Court of Canterbury 8 Aug. 1780.

Elizabeth, dau. of Charles Colyer of Farningham; died 8 and bur. 17 Oct. 1804, aet. 66, at Eynsford. (She was mentioned in the will of her mother-in-law Mary Cox.)

Henry Cox of Charlton aforesaid, and Treverex in the parish of Limpsfield, co. Surrey, Esq., born at Farningham 22 June 1787, and bapt. there 24 July following. On the death of his father, intestate, 1793, he became possessed, in equal parts with his brothers (according to the custom of gavelkind), of the said Stokehaw and Rendlys Hoath estates; and on the death of his grandmother Mary Cox in 1794 he inherited, in equal parts with his said brothers, and by devise by his said grandmother, contained in her codicil dated 1793, the entirety of the said lands at Longfield called Middletons. He disposed of his share of the Chiddingstone estates to his brother John Cox on 10 Aug. 1816, and Middletons to his brother Solomon Penury Cox by conveyance same date.

Charlotte, eldest dau. of Richard Parrott of Cavendish Square, co. Middlesex, Banker, by Charlotte his wife, formerly Burgoyne; born 23 July 1808; married at All Souls', Marylebone, 15 Oct. 1846.

Mary Emma Cox, born 29 Oct. 1847; bapt. at Limpsfield, co. Surrey, 15 Dec. following; she became sole heiress of her family; married 1879.

Walter Tuckfield Goldsworthy, eldest son of T. Goldsworthy of Calcutta, R.N., by his wife Sophia, dan. of W. Tuckfield, R.N.; is Major-General (retired), and late Cornet 8th Hussars; represents Hammersmith in Parliament; of 22 Hertford Street, Mayfair, W., and Yaldham Manor, Sevenoaks, co. Kent.
