To son Thomas Plane and heirs the messuage wherein the butcher now dwelleth in Hale Street, eight acres of land above Brambridges, and land called Pound Fields in East Peckham. To son Wyat Plane and heirs the messuage that William Rolf now inhabiteth in Hadlow Street. To son Michael Plane and heirs five acres of land at Childe Cross, East Peckham; also 20s. a year to be paid him by Henry and Thomas (brothers). To son Francis Plane and heirs two houses, one of which Stephen Wraith inhabiteth in Hadlow Str. Wife Rebecca ex'trix. William Lampard a witness.

HENRY PLANE of Hadlow Street, yeoman. Will proved in Consistory Court, Rochester, 1620, by Thomas Plane, brother. To be buried in East Peckham Churchyard. Brother Thomas all lands, etc., he to pay wife Elizabeth £100. Wife all furniture, apparel, etc. Residue to brother Thomas of East Peckham. Ralph and Judith Rokeby witnesses.

THOMAS PLANE of East Peckham, Kent, yeoman. Will proved in Arches Court of London (Croydon Peculiars) 1634. To be buried in East Peckham Churchyard. My wife Margaret that messuage and tenement in East Peckham during her life, but if she marry then to my eldest son Iden Plane, he to pay her £7 a year. To Wyat Plane my second son £30, payable by Iden within a year of my wife's death. Son Thomas Plane £30. To Francis and Michael Plane the house in Hadlow Street lately purchased of my brother Wyat Plane, to be divided between them, etc.; also £5 each to them at 24. My eldest daughter Rebecca and Margaret Plane £20 at 21. If Iden Plane dies without leaving heirs, then the East Peckham lands, etc., to go to other sons. Wife to have rents of house in Hadlow Str. till sons Thomas and Francis are 24. If she marry again Iden to have them. To poor of East Peckham 20s. Wife ex'trix. "My loving brother George Children of the parish of Tonbridge overseer."

MICHAEL PLANE of Yalding, Kent. Will proved in Consistory Court of Rochester 1667 by brother Francis. To be buried in Peckham Churchyard. To Mary Plane, daughter of my brother Iden, 20s. My brother John Willard 1s. Brother Johan Simons £3. To his two daughters Mary and Margaret Simons at 21 £5 each. Unto my brother Francis Plane's eldest son Thomas that table and form now in my brother Iden's hall. I give to my brother Francis Plane all those other goods and moveables now in the house of my brother Iden. Brother Francis Plane my ex'or all those tenements and appurt's in Hadlow, he to pay my sister Rebecca, wife of John Willard, 20s. a year. Residue to said Francis. To Henry Plane, son of Huggin Plane, 40s. at 21.

THOMAS PLANE of East Peckham, Kent. Will proved by relict 1675 in the Croydon Peculiars. All goods to wife Elizabeth and the child she now goeth with, she to pay Francis Plane my father £20. Edward Simmons a witness.

JASPER PLANE of Tonbridge. Will proved in Prerogative Court of Canterbury 1607. "Being aged and lame." "Thomas Plane of Milton next Sittingbourne, my cosin." Parker Plane of Deptford and his children Parker and John. To William Dixon of Tonbridge £20. Mentions also Bartletts of Tonbridge.

At the early part of the present century a descendant of this family was living at Maidstone, but they seem nearly if not quite extinct at the present time.
