4 19 1 *Nicholas Rittenhouse*, born 1719; died 1787; married Catharine Nyse October 18, 1741; had two sons, Martin and William. Residence, Roxborough, Philadelphia.
- 4 20 2 *William Rittenhouse*, born _____ married _____ He had two children, William and Barbara. Residence, Roxborough, Philadelphia.
- 4 21 3 *Jacob Rittenhouse*, born _____; died 1811 without issue. He was the great grandson of Willem Rittenhouse, the founder of the paper-mill near Germantown, who was succeeded by his son Klaus (Nicholas), who left it to his son William. When he died his son Jacob became the owner, and carried on the business until 1811, when he died, and a family by the name of Markle, also paper-makers, occupied the mill. One of this family, Jacob Markle, married Catharine, the widow of Isaac Rittenhouse, of Roxborough, Philadelphia. Her maiden name was Schwartz.
- Jacob Rittenhouse was a member of the Mennonite Church at Germantown.
- 4 22 4 *Abraham Rittenhouse*, born 1723; died in 1815. His wife was Ann _____. He had a grist and merchant mill above Paper-mill Run, on the Wissahickon, near the Red Bridge, about a half mile below where the paper mill stood. He was a member of the Mennonite Church at Germantown and was chosen one of the
