II. PAUL McLORINAN, of Cranfield, in the Parish of Duncan, Barony of Toome and County of Antrim, gent., (son of Patrick Moder and Margaret,) married Bridget O'Sheill, who survived him and was living in 1717.‡

Issue of *Paul McLorinan* and *Bridget O'Sheill*, his wife:

- i. DAVID, of whom hereafter.
- ii. HUGH, of Cranfield, d. in 1727, and in his will, proved in September of that year, mentions his sons Patrick and Matthew, and directs that he be buried in Cranfield Churchyard among his ancestors.§

III. DAVID McLORINAN, of Cranfield, gent., (son of Paul and Bridget,) was possessed of considerable property at that place, part of which he disposed of in 1717.|| Though his family inherited the Ballywasna estate, it would seem, from the reference in his brother's will to the graves of their ancestors in Cranfield Churchyard, that Cranfield was the ancient home of the family. The parish registers would no doubt throw much light on the family history, but unfortunately they could not be found. David McLorinan, of Cranfield, had issue among others a son, David, of whom hereafter.

IV. DAVID McLORINAN, of Ballyluman, Parish of Ahoghele, Barony of Upper Toome, gent., (son of David of Cranfield,) succeeded two ladies of the family in the possession of the property at that place,¶ part of which he afterward sold to his cousins,
