

CHAPTER XX.

REDDINGE FAMILY.

I. JOSEPH REDDINGE, of Ipswich, Essex County, Mass., was early a member of church at Boston, and probably came over with Governor Winthrop, in the fleet which sailed from Yarmouth, April 7, 1630. He went to Cambridge in 1632; was made a freeman May 14, 1634, and about the year 1637 removed to Ipswich, where he died some time prior to 1677, having appointed his daughter Elizabeth sole executrix of his will, in which he left legacies to her children. The legacies were paid out of the estate left at the decease of his widow, Annice, in 1690. Their only child, Elizabeth, was born about 1634,* and married Samuel Hunt, 1st.
