

## APPENDIX III.

### HENRY WHITE'S PATENT.

---

To all, &c., whereas know ye That I the said Sir William Berkeley, Knight, Governor, &c., give and grant unto Henry White, Junior, seven hundred acres of Land laying on a small Creek called Corawtucks that falls into Kecoughtauke River. Beginning toward the head of the said Creek at a marked Gum by the side of a swamp and running west northwest into the woods 320 poles then south south southwest 350 poles, then east southwest 320 poles to a marked Oak on the Creek by the mouth of a small branch and so up the said Creek to the first station. The said Land being due to the said White by transportation of Fourteen persons, &c. To be Hold, &c., yeilding and paying, &c., provided, &c.
