

APPENDIX XI.

DANIEL STOCKTON'S WILL.

In the name of God, Amen: I Daniel Stockton of Willingborough in the County of Burlington, being in health of body, But Remembering we are all Mortal and men Die in a Moment, Do make and Ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in manner following: First, I do recommend my Soule to almighty God, but my body to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named, in hopes of a Joyful resurrection. Secondly, I Give unto my Executors hereafter named full power to sell all my Estate real and personal, to pay Just Debts and funeral Charges and Legacies, or to keep it paying the same. Item, I give unto my three Daughters Ann Carma, Elizabeth Jones and Abigall Gaskill the Sumc of Twenty Shillings, Each of them to be paid by my Exccutors. Item, I give all the remaining part of my Estate Real and personal unto my five sons, to be Equally Divided amongst them or their heirs, named John Stockton, Daniel Stockton, Richard Stockton, Abraham Stockton and William Stockton said Land or vallue Equally Divided when my Youngest Son is of Age, and I Give my wife Hannah Stockton all the use or Interest of the said Estate real and personal untill my Youngest Son arrives to the Age of Twenty-one, And after that to have Ten pounds a year as long as she remains a widow, to be payed by my five Sons; And I do hereby make, ordain, appoint my wife Hannah Stockton and my two sons John Stockton and Daniel Stockton my Sole Executors of this my Last will and Testament. In witness thereof I have set my hand and Seal this Tenth Day of February in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and fifty-five (1755).
