### NUNCUPATIVE WILL OF ROBERT ISBELL.

---

We, Nathaniel Dudley and Joseph Willcocks, being present at the house of Robert Isbell in Killingworth, when he lay on his death bed, on the 5th of February last past; and the said Isbell then called to us to come to his bed side, and we being come thare, he desired that we would take notice that it was his desire that his wife should have the Improvement of his Estate while she Remained his widow, and when the children come of age that his wife may dispose of the Estate to the Children, as she thinks best; and further, he said that his wife might have it written if she desired it; and according to our best understanding he was of a disposing mind at the time; and this by our desire was committed to writing on the 9th of s<sup>d</sup> Aprill, out of which what is above written is more fairly drawn.
