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CHURCH STREET BLOCK STUDY, DELAMIER HOUSE (AL-803B)

STRUCTURE

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403 Church St. Brick, rectangular (three-bay front) with ell, gable roof, double end chimneys, cast-iron gallery with deck and floor length windows; side hall plan. Built ca. 1860 for J. Delamier; demolished 1960s for urban renewal. See Church Street Block Study (HABS No. AL-803) for photos.

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CHURCH STREET BLOCK STUDY, HAMILTON-GAILLARD HOUSE

STRUCTURE

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407 Church St. Brick, rectangular (three-bay front) with offset ell, gable roof, double end chimneys, two-tiered cast-iron gallery with floor length windows; side hall plan. Built 1859, James Hill and James Robertson, contractors, for Thomas A. Hamilton, who was instrumental in dredging of ship channel in Mobile Bay; acquired by urban

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CHURCH STREET BLOCK STUDY, FREDERICK P. RAVESIES HOUSE

401 Church St. Brick with stucco scored to simulate ashlar, 30' -3" (three-bay front) x49' -6" plus ell and offset E wing, gable roof fronted by raked parapet, double end chimneys, recessed doorway with battered architrave, two-tiered L-shaped rear gallery; side hall plan. Built 1860 for
