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

SIGNIFICANCE (ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL, INCLUDE ORIGINAL USE OF STRUCTURE) Built at a cost of \$8,000. This is one of 19 remaining bungalows surrounding the Hotel Vista del Arroyo, a Pasadena landmark representing the resort hotel lifestyle of early 20th century Southern California. The bungalows though completely detached from the main hotel and often privately financed were dependent on the main facility for dining and services.		
STYLE (IF APPROPRIATE)		
MATERIAL OF CONSTRUCTION (INCLUDE STRUCTURAL SYSTEMS) Wood frame construction with concret foundation, wood floors, brick chimney, stucco covered exterior walls and a tile roof.		
SHAPE AND DIMENSIONS OF STRUCTURE (SKETCHED FLOOR PLANS ON SEPARATE PAGES ARE ACCEPTABLE) L shaped approximately 48' x 58; (see attached plans).		
EXTERIOR FEATURES OF NOTE A one story structure with a flagstone patio at the NW corner,, small frame balcony at the SW corner, and several large 'picture' windows on the north and west elevations for views of the Arroyo Seco.		
INTERIOR FEATURES OF NOTE (DESCRIBE FLOOR PLANS, IF NOT SKETCHED) Originally a two-unit building with three bedrooms and a large paneled living room with built-in bookcases and a brick fireplace.		
MAJOR ALTERATIONS AND ADDITIONS WITH DATES Garage added to east end. (date unknown) 1943-structure converted to serve as ward for McCornack Army Hospital.		
PRESENT CONDITION AND USE Vacant. Poor condition.		
OTHER INFORMATION AS APPROPRIATE Documentation prepared in compliance with Executive Order 11593 for the U.S. General Services Administration. Structure to be demolished in 1982.
