Site Views:

- CA-193-A-1. Site view seen from slope on road at north end of Battery Davis. Panama Mounts are situated at promontory in center of photograph. Looking 320° NNW.
- CA-193-A-2. Site view of promontory cliff face. Foundation of extant Panama Mount is seen protruding from cliff at upper right center. Remains of collapsed Panama Mount are seen at bottom left center. Looking 328° NNW. Camera position is located to left and below promontory as seen in photograph no. 1.
- CA-193-A-3. Panama Mount in rear. Foundation in foreground is base for ammunition depot. Looking 328° NNW.
- CA-193-A-4. Panama Mount. Note concrete ring and metal rail. Note cliff erosion under foundation at left center. Looking 297° W.
- CA-193-A-5. Panama Mount. Note concrete ring and metal rail. Foundation for ammunition depot noted in photograph no. 3 is seen at center rear of mount. Camera position for photograph no. 1 is seen on road at left center distance. Looking 163° S.
- CA-193-A-6. Collapsed Panama Mount on beach as seen in photograph no. 2. Exposed underside to extant Panama Mount and ammunition depot are seen at top of cliff left of center. Looking 342° NNW.
- CA-193-A-7. Alternate view of collapsed Panama Mount on beach. Note concrete ring, metal rail and exposed rebar. Looking 320° NW.
