- CA-170-R-1** Credit PSR. View looks north northeast (18°) down typical dust ditch paralleling First Street. Building 4401 (Hangar No. 1) appears at the extreme right of the view. Building 4456 (Fire House No. 4), Building 4444 (Communications Building), and Building 4505 appear in the background.
- CA-170-R-2** Credit BG. View down dust ditch at northeast side of A Street, looking north northwest in "the loop". Note culverts used to give vehicular and pedestrian access to buildings northeast of A Street, some foundations of which may be seen at right of view. Structures in background belong to Jet Propulsion Laboratory Edwards Facility.
- CA-170-R-3** Credit PSR. View looks east (100°) down dust ditch near Fourth and B Streets in "the loop." In background are Building 4505, Building 4500 (Control Tower) and Building 4456 (Fire House No. 4).
- CA-170-R-4** Credit PSR. View east northeast (60°) down dust ditch. Wing wall of culvert in foreground carries this ditch beneath Second Street near the Utility and Paint Shop foundation (Building 4315).
