SIGNIFICANCE (ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL, INCLUDE ORIGINAL USE OF STRUCTURE) Sarah's Antiques is one of a group of five buildings in College Park located on E. Main Street at the intersection with John Wesley. The group contains three of the oldest commercial structures in town, built to be near the railroad (cont'd)

MATERIAL OF CONSTRUCTION (INCLUDE STRUCTURAL SYSTEMS) Brick Interior walls plastered		
SHAPE AND DIMENSIONS OF STRUCTURE (SKETCHED FLOOR PLANS ON SEPARATE PAGES ARE ACCEPTABLE) See floor plans		
EXTERIOR FEATURES OF NOTE Four fan-light windows on the ground floor side wall. Two oversized (48" wide) windows on the second floor in apartment #2. Rowlock sills under front and side windows. Denticulated roof line with inverted stepped rows of headers and stretchers.		
INTERIOR FEATURES OF NOTE (DESCRIBE FLOOR PLANS, IF NOT SKETCHED) An 8' x 19' loft area created for storage in the mid-section of the storefront. Knotty pine panelling in Apt. #3 on all the ceilings and an arched doorway between the living rm and the kitchen.		
MAJOR ALTERATIONS AND ADDITIONS WITH DATES Rear apartment addition, containing two additional residential units, built c. 1960. Front windows changed to plateglass, date unknown.		
PRESENT CONDITION AND USE Very good condition. Last use for antique store. Building to be demolished for rapid rail construction.		
OTHER INFORMATION AS APPROPRIATE This building was once used for auto repair, though no alterations were made to the building to accommodate automobiles actually driving into it.



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SIGNIFICANCE


