## HISTORIC AMERICAN BUILDINGS SURVEY

### SALLIE ZETTEROWER HOUSE

Location:

331 South Main Street, Statesboro, Bulloch County,  
Georgia (U.S. Highway 301)

USGS Statesboro, Georgia Quadrangle

Significance:

Part of the South Main Street Residential Historic District. The district was listed in the National Register of Historic Places on September 6, 1989 as part of the Downtown Statesboro Multiple Property Nomination. This house is in a district which reflects the continued popularity of late 19th century house forms, as well as the increasing popularity of the bungalow.

The district is also typical of residential neighborhood dating from the 1910's and 1920's, comprised mainly of single-story bungaloid structures constructed in an area with a gridiron street pattern. Houses in the district are arranged on lots perpendicular to the street and vary in setback. The closely spaced residences are freestanding and similar in style and overall character. The house lots vary in width from 60 to 75 feet with small front yards separated from the street by sidewalks.

Description:

The house faces South Main Street, Statesboro, Bulloch County, Georgia (U.S. Highway 301). This two-story, weather boarded gabled ell house features paired 6/1 windows, square porch posts on brick piers supporting a full-length/partially screened front porch.

History:

According to county records, George W. Simmons built this house around late 1918 as his residence. He sold the house to Mrs. C. W. Zetterower who later passed it on to her daughter, Sallie Zetterower. Miss Sallie, as she was affectionately known, was a noted local educator for whom an elementary school is named.

The Sallie Zetterower House was listed in the National Register of Historic Places on September 6, 1989. The building is presently vacant and will be replaced by a commercial bank building.



