Significance: The U.S. Naval Base at Pearl Harbor was designated as a National Historic Landmark in 1964. As a Category 3 structure, it has been determined that Building No. Q339 functioned as part of the Pearl Harbor Naval Base, but is only of minor importance to the historic character of the National Historic Landmark.

Description: Building No. Q339 consists of a single-story quonset hut, approximately 40 feet wide by 100 feet in length, adjoined by a wooden lean-to structure, approximately 25 feet wide by 100 feet in length.

History: Building No. Q339 was constructed in 1944 to serve as a Galley/Kitchen to an adjoining Mess Hall (Building 340) at a cost of \$137,508. Building No. Q339 is currently vacant. The last use for Building No. Q339 was by the Navy Exchange as a retail store, and by the Explosive Ordnance Disposal Group One (EODGRUONE) for operational storage. The condition of Building No. Q339 is inadequate due to its deteriorated state and its location within the explosive arcs of the Whiskey Wharves at the West Loch Branch of Naval Magazine, Lualualei. Building No. Q339 is planned to be demolished in 1994.
