Significance:

The U.S. Naval Base at Pearl Harbor was designated as a National Historic Landmark in 1964. As a Category 3 structure, it has been determined that Building No. MQ39 functioned as part of the Pearl Harbor Naval Base, but is only of minor importance to the historic character of the National Historic Landmark.

Description:

Building No. MQ39 is a single-story quonset hut structure on concrete slab, approximately 20 feet wide by 48 feet in length.

History:

Building No. MQ39 was constructed in 1944 as a temporary structure to serve as an Ammunitions Explosive Maintenance Building at a cost of \$4,999. Building No. MQ39 is currently unoccupied. The condition of Building No. MQ39 is inadequate due to its deteriorated state and its location within the explosive arcs of the Whiskey Wharves at the West Loch Branch of Naval Magazine, Lualualei.
