Location: Naval Submarine Base at the corner of Morton and Craig Streets within the triangular peninsula between Quarry Loch and Magazine Loch.
Pearl Harbor, City and County of Honolulu, Hawaii.

Significance: The Naval Base at Pearl Harbor was designated as a National Historic Landmark in 1964, due to the crucial role it played in the Nation's defense during the twentieth century and the calamitous events which occurred on December 7, 1941. As a Category 3 facility, it has been determined that Building No. 651 functioned as part of the Pearl Harbor Naval Base, and is only of minor importance to the historic character of the National Historic Landmark.

Description: Building 651 is a one-story masonry structure with built-up roofing on concrete roof slab. The building is 85 feet wide, 200 feet long and 20 feet high with a total floor area of approximately 20,240 square feet.

History: Building 651 was constructed in 1923 for use as a battery storehouse and overhaul facility. An existing wooden barracks building which was connected to the building was demolished, and Building 651 was expanded to include construction of mezzanine and installation of two 3-ton crane rails under a modernization project in 1969. A fire sprinkler system will be installed under Subbase Work Request No. 10975.
