**Location:** On First Street, in the main wharf area, NAVMAG West Loch, Pearl Harbor, Hawaii.

**Significance:** This building serves as an excellent intact example of military construction in the 1930s, and is significant as part of the initial base construction.

**Description:** This single-story shop building is linear in plan, and is built of concrete construction with a flat concrete roof. It has two enclosed end sections and six parking bays in the center, which are open on the front side and are enclosed with concrete masonry walls on the back side. The end sections each have one double door, which is steel with glass lights, and a single steel door with four lights and transom. on the front side, and steel windows with concrete sills on the end and back side. A wood mezzanine has been constructed in the west end section. See HABS No. HI-265 for additional description of the base.

**History:** The structure was built in 1932. Drawings indicated that an addition was constructed on the back side in 1944, but this has been removed. The six drive-in bays were originally open all the way through the building, but were later enclosed with the concrete masonry; otherwise, the building appears unaltered. See HABS No. HI-265 for additional history of the base.
