- HI-20-1 VIEW LOOKING SOUTH AS ONE APPROACHES FORT KAMEHAMEHA ON MAMALA BAY DRIVE. THE POST FLAGPOLE REMAINS A FOCAL FEATURE FROM THIS HISTORIC ENTRY ROUTE.
- HI-20-2 VIEW FROM BEHIND THE CHAPEL LOOKING SOUTH TOWARD THE BANDSTAND AND FLAGPOLE.
- HI-20-3 VIEW OF THE FLAGPOLE, BANDSTAND AND CHAPEL FROM THE SOUTH SIDE OF GARDNER AVENUE. THE ROW OF MATURE COCONUT PALMS TO THE RIGHT OF THE CHAPEL DATE TO THE EARLY 1940s.
- HI-20-4 VIEW FROM WORCHESTER AVENUE NEAR MAMALA BAY DRIVE LOOKING NORTH TOWARD THE FLAGPOLE, BANDSTAND, AND CHAPEL. THE FOREGROUND OPEN SPACE WAS FORMERLY THE TRIANGULAR SITE OF THE ORIGINAL OFFICERS' CLUB, LOCATED IN THE CENTER OF THE POST.
- HI-20-5 LOOKING NORTHWEST DOWN WORCHESTER AVENUE SHOWING THE HISTORIC STREETScape COMPRISED OF UNIFORM FRONT YARD SETBACK, OPEN LAWN, SIDEWALK, AND GRASS PLANTING STRIP PARALLELING BOTH SIDES OF THE CENTER ROADWAY.
- HI-20-6 VIEW FROM THE EAST SIDE OF WORCHESTER AVENUE TOWARD THE OCEAN, VISIBLE IN THE DISTANCE ON FAR LEFT OF PHOTOGRAPH. NOTE THE CANOPY TREE IN THE SIDE YARD, A COMMON HISTORIC PATTERN IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD. THE OPEN, GRASSY FRONT AND SIDE YARDS ARE CHARACTER DEFINING. THE TWO HOUSES ARE FORMER COMPANY GRADE OFFICERS' QUARTERS.



- HI-20-7 THE HOUSES ON THE INLAND SIDE OF WORCHESTER AVENUE WERE INTENTIONALLY SITED TO HAVE VIEWS TO THE OCEAN THROUGH THE OPEN SIDE YARDS OF THE WATERFRONT HOUSES, AS SHOWN IN THIS PHOTO TAKEN FROM THE FRONT STOOP OF HOUSE 3333.
- HI-20-8 VIEW FROM DRUM ROAD LOOKING SEAWARD THROUGH THE SIDE YARD BETWEEN HOUSES 3328 AND 3329. NOTE THE LARGE CANOPY (MONKEYPOD) TREE CENTRALLY PLANTED IN THE SIDE YARD, A COMMON FEATURE IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD. THE HOUSE IN THE DISTANCE, ACROSS WORCHESTER AVENUE, IS A FORMER FIELD GRADE OFFICER'S QUARTERS, 3349.
- HI-20-9 VIEW FROM THE NORTHWEST END OF WORCHESTER AVENUE NEAR INTERSECTION WITH DRUM ROAD (AT RIGHT), LOOKING SOUTHEAST. THE HISTORIC STREETScape PATTERN IS VISIBLE, AS WELL AS HISTORIC CANOPY TREES AND COCONUT PALMS.
- HI-20-10 BEACH ROAD IS A NARROW SERVICE ROAD BEHIND AND PARALLEL TO THE WATERFRONT HOUSES. THE BROAD OPEN SPACE AT RIGHT EXTENDS THE LENGTH OF THE NEIGHBORHOOD BETWEEN BEACH ROAD AND THE SHORELINE.
- HI-20-11 THE UNIFORM SETBACK AND NARROW BACK YARDS TYPICAL TO THE HOUSES ARE VISIBLE IN THIS VIEW LOOKING SOUTHEAST DOWN DRUM ROAD, THE INLAND SERVICE ROAD OF THE NEIGHBORHOOD.
- HI-20-12 THE FOUR HOUSES FRONTING HOPE STREET, SHOWN HERE, WERE ADDED TO THE NEIGHBORHOOD ABOUT 1921. THE STREETScape CHARACTER AND PATTERN ARE SIMILAR TO THAT OF WORCHESTER AVENUE.
- HI-20-13 VIEW LOOKING SOUTH DOWN HOPE STREET ON THE BACK SIDE OF THE HOUSES.
- HI-20-14 VIEW TOWARD THE FRONT OF BATTERY HAWKINS FROM THE INTERSECTION OF BEACH ROAD AT MAMALA BAY DRIVE. THE EARTH-COVERED BATTERY IS OVERGROWN WITH KIAWE TREES AND GRASSES.
- HI-20-15 BATTERY HAWKINS ANNEX (CENTER) IS IN CLOSE PROXIMITY TO THE HISTORIC HOUSES (LEFT), AS SEEN IN THIS PHOTO TAKEN FROM THE NORTH.

- HI-20-16 VIEW OF THE ENTRANCE (NORTH) SIDE OF THE FORMER FIRE CONTROL AND PLOTTING STATION (BUILDING 3360). THE OBSERVATION SLIT IS VISIBLE ON THE TOP, REAR SIDE OF THE EARTHCOVERING.
- HI-20-17 REMAINS OF THE WORLD WAR II-ERA, CONCRETE SEAWALL THAT ONCE DEFINED A TRAPEZOIDAL WHARF INDICATE WHERE THE HISTORIC SHORELINE WAS PRIOR TO THE INVASION OF MANGROVE. PHOTO WAS TAKEN FROM THE WEST.
- HI-20-18 VIEW LOOKING NORTHWEST FROM NEAR THE SEAWALL, DEPICTING THE MUDFLATS, SANDY SHORELINE, AND KIAWE VEGETATION CHARACTERISTIC OF THE WATERFRONT BETWEEN THE TENNIS COURTS AND THE SEAWALL, SEAWARD OF BATTERY HAWKINS. THE COASTLINE OF IROQUOIS POINT ACROSS THE ENTRANCE TO PEARL HARBOR AND THE WAI'ANAE MOUNTAINS ARE VISIBLE IN THE DISTANCE.
- HI-20-19 VIEW LOOKING NORTH ALONG THE CURVILINEAR, SANDY SHORELINE THAT BORDERS THE NORTH HALF OF THE DISTRICT. THE DENSE VEGETATION ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE PIER IS VISIBLE IN THE DISTANCE, AT LEFT.
- HI-20-20 VIEW FROM ATOP THE CENTER MAGAZINE SECTION OF BATTERY HASBROUCK LOOKING SOUTHEAST ACROSS THE EAST FIRING PIT. NOTE THE METAL RINGS ON THE FLOOR WHERE THE MORTARS WERE POSITIONED. THE TWO-LEVEL BATTERY RETAINS ITS EARTHEN BERMS, COVERED WITH GRASSES AND KIAWE OVERGROWTH.
