"General Curd Mansion"

This old mansion located in Calloway County, $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles east of Auxvasse, Mo., was built between the years 1840 and 1850 by Joe Lackland, one of the early settlers in this section of the country.

Mr. Lackland was a farmer. He came from the State of Kentucky.

The property was later purchased by Genl. Curd, who served in the Civil War.

At one time the building was used as a Girl's Seminary.

This is a two story brick mansion, Colonial style containing 18 rooms. The house was built by slave labor.
