HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL INFORMATION

The following information was recorded by Alexander Piaget and Charles van Ravenswaay at the time the photograph was taken:

Two and one-half story brick house.

Double doors not original to the house, but were installed during the 1940s. One of the doors was originally used in the office building of the Stone Hill Wine Company, Hermann, built in 1869. The door trim is a copy of the original woodwork used elsewhere in this room.

Doorway with ornamental trim at top is in the southwest bedroom, second floor. This is the only room in the house ornamented in this fashion. Door and door frame are original and contemporary with the building of the house.

PROJECT INFORMATION

The Piaget-van Ravenswaay Survey consists of a number of photographs, primarily of sites and structures in Missouri, which were taken before 1938 by Alexander Piaget and after that by Paul Piaget, both in conjunction with Charles van Ravenswaay. Photographs of buildings were incorporated into the HABS collection in 1985 by Laura Rupp and in 1986 by Deborah Fulton, HABS historians.
