HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL INFORMATION

The following information was recorded by Alexander Piaget and Charles van Ravenswaay at the time the photograph was taken:

Built pre-1836 by Leonard Herold, described as a Pennsylvania German who settled in the area of Augusta after the war of 1812. (laid out Mount Pleasant in 1836 which later became Augusta). Herold sold this house to Arnold Koernschild in 1854.

Two and one-half story hewn log house with a brick one and one-half story rear wing probably constructed by present owner Arnold Koernschild; in the local German style including its original porch. Stone foundation; two story front porch with original chamfered columns and railing; an outside stairway to second floor of the porch.

PROJECT INFORMATION

The Piaget-van Ravenswaay Survey consists of a number of photographs, primarily of sites and structures in Missouri, which were taken before 1938 by Alexander Piaget and after that by Paul Piaget, both in conjunction with Charles van Ravenswaay. Photographs of buildings were incorporated into the HABS collection in 1985 by Laura Rupp and in 1986 by Deborah Fulton, HABS historians.
