HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL INFORMATION

The following information was recorded by Alexander Piaget and Charles van Ravenswaay at the time the photograph was taken:

Built ca. 1852 for Charles Laumeier by a local builder named Dieckmann. Owned in 1962 by Mrs. Walter Bade.

When photographed, this house was in almost its original condition. Its design represents one of the earliest types in the area, and includes many features not found elsewhere. Foundation and walls are stone, the roof of corrugated metal. One and one-half stories plus a full basement. Three rooms are on the main floor, two in the basement, and two in the attic. Original hardware on the attic door; and the original crane is shown in the basement fireplace.

When photographed, the house had been abandoned and was being used for storage purposes.

PROJECT INFORMATION

The Piaget-van Ravenswaay Survey consists of a number of photographs, primarily of sites and structures in Missouri, which were taken before 1938 by Alexander Piaget and after that by Paul Piaget, both in conjunction with Charles van Ravenswaay. Photographs of buildings were incorporated into the HABS collection in 1985 by Laura Rupp and in 1986 by Deborah Fulton, HABS historians.
