Location: Quality Hill, 517 West 10th Street  
Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri

Significance:

This property is significant for its contribution to the integrity of a neighborhood district representing early twentieth century styles of residential, ecclesiastical and small commercial architecture. This property is also significant for its association with prominent Kansas City owners and architects, for its role in the urban growth of Kansas City and as an example of quality urban residential development.

Description:

This is a two and one-half story brick Italianate style building with a flat roof. The main facade looks north with double-leaf doors on the main entrance. The residence has been stuccoed and many of the one-over-one double hung sash windows have been replaced by casement windows with eight lights. The original windows were trimmed with molded limestone lintels which can still be seen on the east and west facades. A semi-hexagonal one-story bay is on the east facade.

History:

This residence was built in 1872 by the architect J. L. Parkinson for Mr. D. M. Jarboe, one of Kansas City's early industrial captains. He formed the firm of Jarboe & Company which established the Keystone Ironworks of Kansas City, the first structural iron works of Kansas City.
