Historical Data:

According to information gathered by Charles S. Boyer and Harry Marvin this building was the toll house on the old Burlington Pike laid out in 1794 by the legislature. It was moved to its present location about 1880. At that time the property was in the possession of John Mitchell. Joseph Fleetwood after whom we named the building obtained possession in 1886 from the estate of Mitchell.
