- NY-553-1 Michigan Central Railway Bridge spanning the Niagara Gorge, looking northwest from the U. S. side. It is a two-hinge, steel deck-arch with Pratt-type bracing and deck-plate-girder approach spans 100 and 123 ft. long. Opened in 1925, and later purchased by the Canadian Pacific Railway, the bridge carries rail traffic only.
- NY-553-2 Deck of the Michigan Central Railway Bridge, looking west from the U. S. side toward Niagara Falls, Canada. To the right is the Whirlpool Rapids Bridge, a bi-level rail (upper) and road (lower) bridge of similar design built in 1897.
