Harry M. Hay House

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Location: 143 Greene Street, Westmont, Johnstown, Cambria County, Pa.

Description: A large, two-and-a-half-story, three-bay single-family residence. The house is highly ornamented with many gables, different-shaped and -sized windows, and large front porch. The slate roof is hipped and has three gables covered with fish-scale shingles. The rest of the wood-framed house is clad with horizontal wood siding. There is a massive pediment over the entrance to the hipped-roof front porch which has a dentiled cornice supported by fluted Ionic columns. Between the columns there is a short balustrade with turned balusters.

History: Harry M. Hay acquired this property from the Cambria Iron Company for \$825 on July 26, 1892. In December of that year, Hay obtained a mortgage for \$2,000, presumably to build his house. Hay's house had an assessed value of \$2,000. He is recorded as being a merchant. By 1922, Earle T. Robinson, a salesman, had purchased the house from Hay.
