Ganahl, Dr. Charles, House ("Zanzenburg") (TEX-377)

Structure

Demolished. Formerly about 1 1/2 miles NE. of Center Point, historic marker at site on Tex. 27. Half-timber with sandstone infilling, 57' (seven-bay front) x 36'4", one story, gabled roof, porch across front; rectangular, six rooms. Built 1857, one of the largest of the early ranch houses, and named Zanzenburg for Ganahl's boyhood home in the Austrian Tyrol. Small, limestone ashlar out-building called "fortress" or "Indian House" nearby. Dr. (over)
