Woodlawn was built on part of the Mount Vernon estate for George Washington's adopted granddaughter, Eleanor Parke Custis Lewis and her husband, Lawrence Lewis, who was George Washington's nephew.

Hyphens: round-arched entrances and floor-length windows, gabled dormers. Wings: gabled dormers; oval lights in gable ends.
