FORT MCCOY, BUILDING T-10108
(World War II Temporary Buildings, Store House (M.D.))
HABS NO. WI-308-DT

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Location: On the north side of South Sixth Avenue, in the southeast quadrant of the hospital area, Block 10 of the main cantonment at Fort McCoy, Sparta vicinity, Monroe County, Wisconsin.

Significance: Building T-10108 is a Store House (M.D.), Type SH-7. There are six Type SH-7 buildings located at the south end of the hospital area.

Description: Single story, wood frame construction on concrete piers; cement asbestos shingle exterior siding (heavy construction paper secured with 1" x 2" battens is shown on plan number 700-461), asphalt shingle roof at 5/12 pitch; five 16" round-metal ventilators at roof ridge. Main axis runs southeast/northwest; three entrances: one pair of wood doors, each single unit with five recessed panels, located at the west corner or the northwest side; a pair of wood doors, each single unit with five recessed panels located at the southeast side; a replacement sliding door, 6'-6" x 7'-5", located at the west side; total of twenty-five six-over-six double-hung wood windows, all windows fitted with metal window guards. The concrete platform, which is 3'-11" above grade, was originally wood. The platform at the southeast side has been removed. Overall dimensions: 25'-4" x 126'-2" (14 bays of 9'); approximately 14' to roof ridge. Interior plan: open bay with exposed, rafters and framing, wood floors.

History: Erected on September 26, 1942 during the initial construction phase at Camp McCoy (as Fort McCoy was then known) during the mobilization build-up for World War II. Constructed by the firm of J.P. Cullen and Son of Janesville, Wisconsin. Based on Plan Number 700-461, Type S-H-6 & SH-7, Store House (M.D.), from the 700 Series of standard construction drawings. Cost of construction was \$13,844.00.
