Location: Standard Lime & Stone Quarry, west-central portion of plant area, County Route 27, Millville, Jefferson County, West Virginia.

UTM: 18.4353540.26090  
Quad: Charles Town, West Virginia

Significance: The Storage/Supply Building is one of three intact surviving examples of vernacular support structures used at the Standard Lime & Stone Quarry plant.

Description: The building is a one-story, one-room, wood-framed structure with a gable roof, measuring roughly 15 by 57 feet. The building is clad in corrugated metal, and has one door opening on the east side. It is unaltered and in good condition, but it is engulfed in vegetation.

History: The building was constructed by the Standard Lime & Stone Company between 1920 and 1935. During the late 1930s, it was used as a general storage and supply building.
