WILKINS FARM, WORKSHOP/STORAGE BUILDING HABS NO WV-264-G

- Location: South side of Dove Hollow Road, approximately 6,000 feet east of its intersection with West Virginia Route 259, Lost River vicinity, Hardy County, West Virginia
- Significance: A typical farm outbuilding, this workshop/storage building played an important function in maintaining farm equipment and structures. It was erected in the early 20th century based on an inspection of the building materials.
- Description: This diminutive two story building consists of a rendered concrete block lower story with a superimposed wood framed upper story. The lower story is a semi-basement with a pair of symmetrical windows flanking each side of the door on the northeast facade. The second story has a single window over the door. The upper floor is framed with horizontal drop siding (and framed to overhang) the lower story. Asphalt shingles were used to cover the wood framed roof.
- History: This structure is typical of a rural workshop constructed in the second half of the 20th century. Its date of construction is unknown, but the building materials indicate that it was built in the early 20th century.
